In respect of State share, the Government has allowed NABARD to raise zero cost bonds, the interest of which shall be borne by the Central Government so that overall interest rate for State share comes to about 6% so as to make it attractive for the States and encourage them to</li> </ol>	A committee headed by Shri Brijmohan Agarwal, minister (Water resources) of Chhattisgarh identified 99 projects for completion by Dec, 2019 with total potential utilization of these projects as 76.03 lakh hectares.	145 districts of the Country would directly be benefitted from these 99 projects. Likely potential utilisation through these 99 projects is estimated to be 76 lakh hectares. The implementation of the Scheme would help all categories of farmers in the command of the projects proposed to be completed, spread across many States of the Country. It will especially be beneficial for the poorest farmers in the DPAP/DDP areas as around 60 % of the projects included in the scheme would benefit those areas.	Apart from release of Central Assistance (CA) of Rs. 825 crore from the budget of ministry, CA of Rs. 3337 crore was released through NABARD for AIBP and CAD works of these 99 projects during 2016-17. Further, state share of Rs. 3334 Crores has been released. In addition, an amount of Rs. 2514 crore has been released for Polavaram Project of Andhra Pradesh during the year so far.
