## Cabinet nod for ₹2,776-cr road project in Himachal

New Delhi, June 7

The Centre today approved fourlaning of a road stretch to be developed at an estimated cost of ₹2,776 crore in Himachal Pradesh.

The decision was taken at the Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) meeting, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

The CCEA has approved fourlaning from 'the end of Pandoh Bypass to Takoli' section of National Highway 21 in Himachal Pradesh, the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways said in a statement. The project will help in reducing the time and cost of travel, it said.

"The cost is estimated to be ₹2,775.93 crore, including cost of land acquisition, resettlement and rehabilitation and other pre-construction activities. The length of the road to be developed is approximately 19 km," it said.

"This work will be done under the National Highways Development Project (NHDP) Phase IV B on Hybrid Annuity Mode," it said. Employment potential of approximately 77,000 mandays will be generated locally during the construction period.
